**Genealogical Information
relating to
Ancestors and Descendants
of
Samuel Kendig Rupley**

The final section of the family album assembled by A. S. Rupley has genealogical information on the Rupley and Kendig ancestors and the Rupley, Schwartz and Wyatt descendants of S. K. Rupley. This information is given in a series of documents that are listed below. Following the introductory text pages, each document is attached in sequence.

DOCUMENTS:

Jacob Rupley (Rubli).

7 pages, including 2 pages of church records supplied by the Staatsarchiv Zurich and a map of the region of Switzerland where are found the towns of Laufen and Dachsen.

Nancy Rupley Armstrong of Houston, Texas, and Dr. Poucher, who carried out research on the Rupley family, supplied information on Jacob Rupley, birth name Rubli, the immigrant patriarch of the Rupley families in America, including: his birth in Switzerland, his emigration to this country, his Revolutionary War service, his marriages and family, and his death and burial. A. S. Rupley, through the good offices of the European Manager of W. R. Grace, obtained the church records listing the christening of Jacob Rubli at Laufen on July 9, 1724.

The Last Will and Testament of Jacob Rupley.

6 pages.

His second wife Mary is bequeathed 50 acres, a 20x30 ft log cabin, beds, and cattle, so that she can live comfortably. In the division of his property, the seven children of his deceased first son George are included [George and his son John are in the line of descent from Jacob Rupley to S. K. Rupley]. The husbands of four of his female children are listed. The executors are his wife Mary, his son-in-law Adam Fonderau, and "his trusty friend George Kober", of East Pennsborough.

Line of Descent: Jacob Rupley through Samuel Kendig Rupley branch, following Rupley name.

1 page.

A list of 9 men bearing the Rupley name, born over a 242-year span. As far as can be determined, each is the oldest male child with male issue [a question is whether Isaac (b 1813), the older brother of Samuel Rupley (b 1815), had male issue].

Several comments on the data:

- The name of S. K. Rupley's mother, Martha in this table and in other Rupley family records (possibly collected by Mary/Martha (Kendig) Rupley herself), is given as Mary Magdalena in LDS records for Samuel Rupley (her husband), as Mary M. in LDS records for S. K. Rupley, and variously as Mary and Martha in census records where she was head of household.
- The date of birth of S. K. Rupley, 1844 in this table, is given as 17 Jul 1843 in his 1861 christening record (which gives an erroneous middle name, Kendrick, and thus may be suspect) and implied as 1843 in his Civil War military discharge papers, which state 21 years of age on 14 Jun 1865 (but the age may have been rounded off to the nearest year).
- The date of marriage of S. K. Rupley with Jane E. Shurter is not given; it can be inferred as 1865-1866 from the date of SKR's mustering out of Civil War service and the date of birth of Harry M. Rupley.
- The name of John Rupley's wife, Ann Gener in this table, is given as Anna Sener, with marriage date 19 Apr 1804, in LDS records.
- The name of George Rupley's wife, Marta Kauffman in this table, is given as Maria Kaufman in LDS records and as Ann Kaufman with marriage date 7 Nov 1770 in records of Lancaster County marriages.

Note that both the last two items above can reflect transcription errors: "G" for "S", and "t" for "i".

Descendants of Samuel K. Rupley.

3 pages.

This table lists dates of birth, marriage and death and names of spouses for the descendants of S. K. Rupley, describing about 100 years of family events, from the birth in 1866 of Harry Mortimer Rupley to about 30 Mar 1970, when the data were assembled. The table appears to be complete and accurate, except of course, it lacks information on family events from 1970 to the present.

Family Tree: Genealogical Information Assembled by Harry Mortimer Rupley.

3 images of manuscript sheets. A gedcom file for a database constructed from this tree, exactly as given by H. M. Rupley, without modification, is available on request.

H. M. Rupley (HMR) connected 321 names in a genealogical tree, giving information on:

- descendants of Samuel Kendig Rupley (SKR) and of his Rupley siblings, two of which had issue (Susan and Daniel E.);
- Kendig ancestors of SKR, including their siblings, back to the immigrant patriarch, Martin Kendig (five generations);
- descendants of some siblings of Kendig ancestors, i.e., descendants of selected aunts and uncles, greataunts and greatuncles, etc.

The tree is drawn on three manuscript sheets. The main sheet is signed, "HM Rupley, March 20, [18]93." Two shorter, secondary sheets that link into the main sheet have information on the Samuel K. and Daniel E. Rupley branches, comprising 18 and 22 entries, respectively, of names not on the main sheet. The additions extend the Samuel K. Rupley branch to 1933.

Essentially no date information was included by HMR. The tree describes family relationships only.

Some place information was included, for the location of various children and grandchildren of Abraham Kendig and Mary Lane. [The default, in the absence of a stated location, presumably being Lancaster, Pennsylvania.]

No sources were cited, i.e., the information is from written or oral records of Kendig family history, possibly kept by Mary/Martha (Kendig) Rupley.

There is a major connectivity error:

- Martin Kendig (wife Betsey Neff, given as Keff by HMR) is listed by HMR as the son of the immigrant patriarch Martin, not as the son of John Jacob Kendig and Alice Wade, as given in various documented sources.

Except for the above, casual comparison of parts of the tree with online sources (especially, the Kendig Genealogy project, at www.genealogy.kendig.info, and the LDS site, www.familysearch.com) indicates that the HMR information is substantially correct, e.g.:

- The siblings of SKR's Kendig grandfather Samuel (the children of Abraham Kendig and Mary Lane), agree in number (8) and in name; HMR lists the spouses of 7 of the siblings and gives lines of descent for 5 of them - information that is not found in the comparison online sources.

- The siblings of SKR's Kendig greatgrandfather Abraham (the children of John Jacob Kendig and Alice Wade) agree in number (8 including Martin) and in name except for Ann, who is listed as Esther in the online sources; the names of spouses of the siblings agree, except for Isaac and a probable misspelling of Herr as Hem, as the spouse of Ann/Esther.

The tree is incomplete (as is to be expected):

- Except for the Rupley branch, entries are for people born before about 1850. [this cutoff date and the focus on Kendig ancestors of SKR suggests that much of the genealogical information may have been assembled by Mary/Martha (Kendig) Rupley and later transcribed and lightly fleshed out with newer information by HMR, her grandson.]
- Unlisted children and unlisted marriages result in selective truncation of branches of the tree and thus a focus on particular lines of descent.

HMR not unreasonably emphasized the Kendig descendants associated most closely with the line leading to marriage into the Rupley family: the descendants of Abraham Kendig and Mary Lane are followed for two or three generations.

This information appears to fill gaps in Kendig family information found online:

- Spouses and descendants are listed for 5 of the 8 children of Abraham Kendig and Mary Lane;
- These comprise about 240 people not listed in the other sources of Kendig family tree information that were checked; these people and their descendants (presumably in total much greater than 240 in number, taking into account those born between about 1850 and the present) are linked into the Kendig family tree by the HMR genealogy.

The spelling by HMR of some surnames is suspect, e.g., Honery (Howry?), Deherau (Dehaven?), Lighton (Lightner?), Keff (Neff?), Hoorn (Hoover?), Medinan (?), Mussleman (Musselman?), Sides (sometimes Seitz?), Gofu (Goff?), Hem (Herr?), etc. [One imagines HMR might have made errors transcribing information assembled by his grandmother Mary/Martha (Kendig) Rupley.]

Henry Clifford: Naturalization Papers.

Images of these documents are not attached below.

Henry Clifford, father of Jane Clarkson "Jennie" Clifford, wife of H. M. Rupley, was born in England. It was said that his daughter Jane was born in Mexico, when he was in that country as an engineer engaged in construction of railroads. Later, in this country, in Poughkeepsie, he was manager of the city water works.

- On 2 Oct 1868, in the ninety third Year of Independence of the United States, he was naturalized (admitted to become a citizen) in the Supreme Court of Dutchess County, NY. He then resided at Middle Granville, Washington County, NY.
- On 27 Apr 1875, in the 99th year of the Independence of the United States, he was naturalized (for the second time?) in the Court of Common Pleas for the City and County of New York.

Part 2: Personal Papers and Letters of Samuel Kendig Rupley.

The personal papers and letters of S. K. Rupley are described in Part 2 of this three-part description of the album assembled by A. S. Rupley. By virtue of describing events and aspects of S. K. Rupley's life, the papers of Part 2 constitute part of his genealogy, which fact deserves to be noted and made reference to here in Part 3.

JACOB RUPLÉ (RUBLI)

The following appears as a heading on a genealogical chart of "Jacob Ruplé" which Judge John Rupley Schwartz obtained from Dr. Poucher who did limited research of the "Rupley" family in America.

Jacob Ruplé was born June 19, 1724 at Dachsen, baptized July 9, 1724 at Laufen, Switzerland (Canton Zurich). Arrived at Philadelphia September 20, 1743, Ship Phoenix from Rotterdam last from Gower - Settled in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania - was elected member of Committee of Observation in November 1775 - Served in Lancaster County Militia - moved to Cumberland County - was Lieutenant of 7th Co. (Capt. John Carothers commanding) 3rd Battalion, Cumberland Co. Militia - Was twice married. He died January 10, 1793. His grave is at Poplar Church near Harrisburg. His Will names 17 children but not in order of birth. Name was early changed to "Rupley" - Other name changes have been made.

The data in the foregoing paragraph is substantiated in all major respects by information in connection with the genealogical chart of his daughter Elizabeth Rupley (Stine) which adds the following information:

He (Jacob Ruplé) died in East Pennsborough Township, Cumberland County, Pennsylvania, January 10, 1793, and is buried in Poplar Church Cemetery, a few miles from the Susquehanna River opposite Harrisburg. His Will is recorded at Carlisle, the County Seat of Cumberland County. He left an unusually large estate to be divided between his widow (Mary - his second wife) and his 17 children.

He was twice married - first to Anna Barbara Loughman with whom he had eight children, and secondly to Mary (Maria) Schaeffer with whom he had nine children.

The original family name of Ruplé took various forms, i.e., "Rupple", "Roopley" and finally "Rupley" which has been accepted by the various descendants in the United States.

As a study of maps available to me showed no Laufen or Dachsen, I asked our European Manager to locate both towns for me so I could find whether Dachsen was in Switzerland or Germany and which country controlled the areas in 1724.

They consulted the State Archive Office, Canton of Zurich, Zurich, Switzerland which provided the following information:

Laufen and Dachsen are located in the Canton of Zurich in Switzerland and these villages became part of the Canton of Zurich in 1544.

Jacob Rubli, the son of Ulrich and Elsbeth Rubli both from Dachsen, was baptized in the Church of Laufen near the Rhine waterfall on July 9, 1724 and this is recorded in "Stoz E III 68.3, page 187", a copy of this page follows.

From the foregoing it will be seen that a Jacob Rubli (a wagoner) and his wife from Dachsen witnessed the baptism of Jacob. The entry immediately above shows that a Heinrich Rubli was baptized on July 2, 1724 whose parents were Mathaeus and Erna Rubli from Dachsen and at the bottom of the page, on August 10, 1724, Conrad and Erna Rubli from Dachsen presented their daughter Maria for baptism.

The information from the State Archive Office Zurich goes on to say that "The Rublis were among the free citizen families of Dachsen since the early 15th century and in 1810 had the most members of any family in Dachsen."

The State Archive also forwarded a photostat of a page from the Church of Laufen dated 1403 which shows that Revenues from the Village of Dachsen included:

"Hans Rubli donate 7 shillings 4 pence, and 2 autumn chickens and 20 eggs"

The information received ended with the following remarks:

"We have now traced the date and place of birth of Jacob Rubli. The date and place of the latter's baptism are identical with the records of Mr. A. S. Rupley so there is practically no doubt that Jacob Rubli and Ruplé and Ruppulé are one and the same person."

It would seem that the foregoing conclusion is correct. The German-Swiss pronunciation of Rubli would come out Ruplé in English pronunciation and it was not unusual for a European name to take the English equivalent in America. In fact, the two sources of information that Dr. Poucher found in Pennsylvania both mentioned name changes - the first

"The name Rubli was early changed to Rupley - other name changes have been made -"

and the second

"The original name of Ruplé took various forms, i.e., Ruppule, Roppley, Rupley, etc."

The following map locates Laufen and Dachsen and the State Archive description is:

Dachsen is a very small village on the left bank of the Rhine below Laufen and belongs to the church district of Laufen. It is situated opposite Altenburg, a town in Baden (Germany).

The Last Will and Testament of Jacob Rupley.

IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN, I, Jacob Rupley, of the Township of East Pennsborough, in the County of Cumberland, in the State of Pennsylvania, yeoman, being of sound and disposing mind, memory and understanding, do make and declare this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form following, to wit-

Item. It is my Will and I do order and direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid off and discharged as soon as conveniently may be done after my Decease.

Item. I do give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife, Mary, one horse or mare, two cows and two sheep, allowing her the choice among my cattle, and my two best beds with the bed-steads and bed clothes thereto belonging. And I do also give and bequeath unto my said Wife, Mary, Fifty Acres of Land, part of the plantation whereon I now live, that is to say-Forty Acres of Clear Land and Ten Acres of Wood Land, to be surveyed and laid off to her in one entire piece at such place as she shall direct. TO HOLD the said Fifty Acres of Land with the Appurtenances unto my said Wife to and for her proper use and benefit for and during the time of her natural life. And it is my Will and I do hereby order and direct that my Executors hereafter named do as soon as conveniently may be done after my decease, build, erect and finish in and upon the said Fifty Acres of land a Logg Dwelling House of the Dimensions of thirty feet in Depth and twenty-six feet in breadth, and cause the same to be well and sufficiently completed so that my said Wife can or may live comfortably therein, and I do give and allow unto unto her my said Wife, full and free right, liberty and privilege to live in and occupy the same Dwelling House with out molestation or interruption during the term of her natural life, and it is further my Will that all the Costs, Charges and Expenses attending the

building, finishing and completing the said Dwelling House, be defrayed out of my Estate,--Which said legacies and bequests to my said Wife are, and are hereby declared to be and shall be deemed and taken for and in lieu and in full satisfaction of and for her Dower of Thirds at Common Law and all calims and Demands whatsoever of, in into or out of my Estate.

Item. After the Decease of my said Wife, Mary, I order, direct and empower my two remaining Executors or the Survivor of them and the Executors or Administrators of such Survivor to sell and dispose of the said Fifty Acres of land (hereinbefore given and bequeathed unto my said Wife during her natural life) with the Appurtenances either by public or private Sale, as to them or him shall seem meet and to give Conveyances and Assurances for the same to the Purchaser or Purchasers thereof, in Fee Simple, and the Monies arising by the sale thereof to be equally divided to and amongst all my children hereinafter named, and the seven children of my Deceased Son, George, they taking such share thereof as would have descended to their deceased father (my son George) to be equally divided to and between them my said Grandchildren.

Item. I do give, devise and bequeath unto my son, Jacob Rupley, the Quantity of One Hundred Acres of land now in his Tenure or Occupation. Part of the Plantation whereon I now live, situated in East Pennsborough, Township aforesaid, to be surveyed and laid off to him by my Executors if not done by myself, along Conedogwainet Creek. To have and to hold the said One hundred Acres of Land with the Appurtenances unto my Son, Jacob, his Heirs and Assigns forever. And I do value and charge the same premises to my said Son, Jacob, at and for the Sum of Seven hundred Pounds payable in manner following, to wit- One Hundred Pounds immediately after my decease and Fifty Pounds yearly and every year thereafter until the whole be paid off and discharged, and be disposed of or distributed as is hereinafter directed. And as my said Son, Jacob, hath possessed and occupied

the same land and Premises since the first day of April in the year One thousand seven hundred and Eighty-two (or thereabouts) and taken the issues and Profits thereof to his own use, it is therefore my Will and I do hereby further order and direct that my said Son, Jacob, do pay unto my Executors (if not paid to myself) a Rent at the Rate of Fifteen Pounds yearly and every year from the said Time until the Time of my decease to be disposed of as hereinafter directed, over and besides the said Seven hundred Pounds charged upon and payable for the same as aforesaid.

AND WHEREAS, I have agreed with and verbally sold unto my Son, Conrad Rupley, One hundred Acres of Land situated in East Pennsborough aforesaid (Part and Parcel of a Tract of Two hundred Acres which I purchased from John Penn, Esquire,) at and for the Sum of Six hundred Pounds and he hath paid unto me One hundred Pounds part thereof. It is therefore my Will that if my said Son, Conrad, do pay off and discharge all the Residue or remainder unpaid to me in my life time, of the said Six hundred Pounds, together with the lawful interest for the same, from the date of a certain Receipt from Mr. Penn to me for part of the purchase money of the said lands. Then and in such Case my Executors or Administrators of such Survivor shall and I do hereby direct and empower them or any or either of them to make and execute unto my said Son, Conrad, such good and sufficient Deed or Conveyance as shall be proper and necessary to assure unto him, my said Son, Conrad, and Estate in Fee Simple in the Premises.

Item. I do hereby authorize, direct and empower my Executors hereinafter named, or the Survivors or Survivor of them, or the Executors or Administrators of such Survivor, by public or private Sale as to them or him shall seem proper to sell and dispose of all the Residuer Remainder of my Estate both Real and Personal, (not hereinbefore particularly disposed of) and to make and execute such good and sufficient Deeds and

Conveyances as shall be proper and necessary to assure unto the purchaser or purchasers an Estate or Estates in Fee Simple in the Premises, and the Monies arising by the sale or sales aforesaid, to be disposed of or distributed in the manner hereinafter directed.

Item. The Monies due and payable by my Sons, Jacob and Conrad, as aforesaid, and the Monies arising by the sale and sales of my Estate and Estates aforesaid, and all other Monies Estate and Effects whatsoever which I shall die possessed of (after all my just debts and the expenses of building and finishing a Dwelling House for the use of my Wife, as hereinbefore directed are first paid thereout) I give and bequeath unto all my children and Grand children in manner following, towit-

One equal Seventeenth part thereof I do give and bequeath unto my Son, Jacob Rupley, his Heirs, Executors, Administrators and Assigns.

One equal Seventeenth part thereof I do give and bequeath unto my Son, Michael Rupley, his Heirs, Executors, Administrators and Assigns.

One other equal seventeenth part thereof I do give and bequeath unto my Son, Conrad Rupley, his Heirs, Executors, Administrators and Assigns. One other equal seventeenth part thereof I do give and bequeath unto my Son, Frederick Rupley, his Heirs, Executors, Administrators and Assigns. One other equal Seventeenth part thereof I do give and bequeath unto my Son, John Rupley, his Heirs, Executors, Administrators and Assigns. One other equal seventeenth part thereof I do give and bequeath unto my Son, Abraham Rupley, his Heirs, Executors, Administrators and Assigns. One other equal Seventeenth part thereof I do give and bequeath unto the Seven Children of my deceased Son, George, their respective Heirs, Executors, Administrators and Assigns, to be equally divided to and between them share and share alike. One other equal Seventeenth part thereof I do give and bequeath unto my Daughter, Dorothea, the wife of Daniel Frank, her Heirs, Executors, Administrators and Assigns. One other equal

Seventeenth part thereof I do give and bequeath unto my Daughter, Magdalene, the wife of Dewalt Erford, her Heirs, Executors, Administrators and Assigns. One other equal Seventeenth part thereof I do give and bequeath unto my Daughter, Margaret, the wife of Adam Fonderau, her Heirs, Executors, Administrators and Assigns. One other equal Seventeenth part thereof I do give and bequeath unto my Daughter, Barbara, the wife of John Swineford, her Heirs, Executors, Administrators and Assigns. One other equal seventeenth thereof I do give and bequeath unto my Daughter, Mary Rupley, her Heirs, Executors, Administrators and Assigns. One other equal seventeenth part thereof I do give and bequeath unto my Daughter, Elizabeth Rupley, her Heirs, Executors, Administrators and Assigns. One other equal seventeenth part thereof I do give and bequeath unto my Daughter, Ann Rupley, her Heirs, Executors, Administrators and Assigns. One other equal seventeenth part thereof I do give and bequeath unto my Daughter, Catherine Rupley, her Heirs, Executors, Administrators and Assigns. One other equal seventeenth part thereof I do give and bequeath unto my Daughter, Susanna Rupley, her Heirs, Executors, Administrators and Assigns, and the other equal seventeenth part thereof I do give and bequeath unto my Daughter, Sophia Rupley, her Heirs, Administrators, Executors and Assigns.-Provided, always and it is further my Will that if any or either of my children or their representatives shall set up and bring any account or make any demand against my Executors for or concerning any work or service done or performed for me after their arriving to or attaining the age of twenty one years. Then in case such child or children or their legal representatives shall be entitled unto and receive Five Shillings and no more, which shall be in full of and for his, her or their full share or proportion of and in my whole Estate, and shall be utterly barred and excluded of and from any further part, share or proportion of in and to my Estate aforesaid, and further his, her or

their share or part shall descend to and be distributed to and amongst the remainder of the children aforesaid and my said Grandchildren, in the manner shares or proportions hereinbefore expressed, anything hereinbefore contained to the Contrary in anywise notwithstanding.

AND LASTLY, I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my said Wife, Mary, my said Son in Law, Adam Fonderau, and my trusty friend, George Kober, of East Pennsborough aforesaid, and the survivors and survivor of them. Executors and Executor of this my Last Will and Testament hereby revoking and making null and void all former and other Will and Wills by me made, and declaring this and no other to be and contain my Last Will and Testament.
